The Ascension of the Lord - 12 May 2024

In today's feast of the Ascension of Jesus from the earthly to the heavenly realm, we celebrate our belief that the Lord continues to be with us, but in a new way. No longer is he present to us as he was physically before his death, nor is he with us as he seems to have been for a short time after his resurrection when he appeared to his disciples in bodily form. Now he is present to us through the life of his Spirit in us and in the community.

In the Second Reading from St Paul's Letter to the Ephesians, we hear some of the ways which demonstrate the life and energy of the Spirit in the community: some reflect that life and energy through their *gift* as *apostles*; others as *prophets*; others as *evangelists* and yet others as *pastors and teachers*. We might think we don't seem to fall into any of those categories – but we do! We mightn't be "professionals" in the way in which we might think of those *gifts* or roles, but in the particular circumstances of our lives, we exercise those gifts by the ways in which we reach out to others, listen to others, encourage others, help and support others and witness to our belief in God and the values of the Gospel in all sorts of ways by the manner of our lives. When we are kind and generous, gentle, tolerant, patient, merciful, forgiving, compassionate, take a stand against injustice, pray and worship God, we are exercising the gifts of the Spirit with which we have been blessed. The exercise of these gifts builds unity and peace. The more these gifts are exercised, the more unity and peace become a reality.

In today's Gospel from St Mark, we hear Jesus talking to the eleven disciples to whom he appeared after his resurrection, commissioning them to *Go out to the whole world; proclaim the Good News to all creation*. He tells them they will be given extraordinary powers to help them do this; they will be able to cast our devils, have the gift of tongues, harmlessly pick up snakes and drink deadly poison - and heal the sick! We don't expect to have the same powers (and some we might not want!), but we believe that we are gifted with the same Spirit and the gifts given to us to *proclaim the Good News.*

REFLECTION

Called, chosen, sent to be God's Heart

The feast of the Ascension commemorates the return of Jesus to the Father. Jesus leaves in body but remains with us through the gift of the Spirit. We will celebrate the gift and presence of the Holy Spirit in next Sunday's feast of Pentecost.

The true meaning of our feast today is not found in Jesus' leaving, but in the way he calls his disciples back together, to re-form them as a new community entrusted with the spread of the Gospel. Jesus sends the disciples out to make disciples of all nations and to teach them his way. But the disciples are not left to do all that on their own. Jesus promises that he is with them always.

Jesus has called the ragged, group of disciples, scattered after his crucifixion, back to himself to form them, fragile and doubtful as they are, into a community for mission in the name of God. The task of the historical Jesus is complete; the task of the church as the living Body of Christ has just begun. It is comforting to recognise that Jesus doesn't insist on perfection before he calls us and entrusts us with his mission.

This mission is authorised by God and passed on to us through Jesus. It is not about authority over others. It is actually a call to act as God would act, true to God's heart as Jesus has taught us.

Ever since Easter, we have been proclaiming that Jesus is alive. The feasts of the Ascension and Pentecost help us to realise that we are part of a long tradition of faithful disciples. We have our faults and failings, but our call is to witness to and teach the way of Jesus by the kind of people we are, the values and attitudes we hold, in thought, word and action - to be the living presence of God in the world today.

FIRST READING

Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is,' he had said, 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

SECOND READING

Ephesians 4:1-7. 11-13

I, the prisoner in the Lord, implore you to lead a life worthy of your vocation. Bear with one another charitably, in complete selflessness, gentleness and patience. Do all you can to preserve the unity of the Spirit by the peace that binds you together. There is one Body, one Spirit, just as you were all called into one and the same hope when you were called. There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism, and one God who is father of all, over all, through all and within all.

Each one of us, however, has been given his own share of grace, given as Christ allotted it. The one who rose higher than all the heavens to fill all things is none other than the one who descended. And to some his gift was that they should be apostles; to some, prophets; to some, evangelists; to some, pastors and teachers; so that the saints together make a unity in the work of service, building up the body of Christ. In this way we are all to come to unity in our faith and in our knowledge of the Son of God, until we become the perfect Man, fully mature with the fullness of Christ himself.

Mark 16:15-20

Jesus showed himself to the Eleven and said to them, 'Go out to the whole world; proclaim the Good News to all creation. The one who believes and is baptised is saved; the one who does not believe will be condemned. These are the signs that will be associated with believers: in my name they will cast out devils; they will have the gift of tongues; they will pick up snakes in their hands, and be unharmed should they drink deadly poison; they will lay their hands on the sick, who will recover.'

And so the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven: there at the right hand of God he took his place, while they, going out, preached everywhere, the Lord working with them and confirming the word by the signs that accompanied it.
