Fifth Sunday of Lent - 17 March 2024

Dear sisters and brothers.

In the 1st Reading this weekend, we hear the Prophet Jeremiah giving heart and hope to the Israelites in their exile in Babylon. This state of affairs is interpreted as God punishing the people and teaching them a lesson for their infidelity to the solemn agreement – the "Covenant" – as outlined in the "Law" (the 10 Commandments) that God had given them through Moses on Mount Sinai.

Jeremiah reassures them, however, that God will make a "new covenant" with them. This new covenant will not be written on stone tablets, like that handed down through Moses, but it will be written "on their hearts" and planted "deep within them". This new covenant is based on the personal loving relationship God will establish with each of them and in doing so "will forgive their iniquity and never call their sin to mind". This new covenant relationship will, as we know, be established through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus.

In today's Gospel from St John, we hear that when Jeus went up for the festival in Jerusalem, some Greeks indicated that they wanted to "see Jesus". When this request is conveyed to Jesus, it prompts him to reflect on what "seeing him" involves. He uses the parable about the grain of wheat needing to die in order to "yield a rich harvest". In his own case, this will involve literally dying on the cross. However, this is necessary in order for him to rise from the dead to eternal glory.

Jesus goes on to say that anyone who claims to "serve him" must enter into the same dynamic of dying to self in order to rise to eternal glory: wherever I am, my servant will be there too. If anyone serves me, my Father will honour him (or her) ... And when I am lifted up from the earth, I shall draw all men (people) to myself.

So, the new covenant that is planted deep within us, written on our hearts, is the personal loving relationship with Jesus extended to each of us. This includes the "Greeks", that is, non Israelites as well as Israelites. This relationship, this new covenant, enables us, like Jesus, to offer our lives in loving service to others. In so doing, we share in his glory.

REFLECTION

A new bond of love and life

The first reading this Sunday tells us that our journey to transfiguration happens from within, by our hearts being changed. The prophet Jeremiah looks forward to a new covenant between God and his people. This covenant will not be written in stone, but in human hearts. This new covenant cannot be broken since God always forgives and never remembers our sins. It is in our hearts that we learn the truth about the strength of God's love for us and recognise ourselves as God's own people.

There is a lovely phrase in the preface of Eucharistic Prayer for Reconciliation I which captures this sense: You have bound the human family to yourself through Jesus your Son, our Redeemer, with a new bond of love so tight that it can never be undone.

The words of John's Gospel help answer the question about how this covenant is made. God's love is revealed in a weak and suffering human being through whom God offers his own life as the pledge of love and forgiveness which seals this new covenant.

When some Greeks come asking to see Jesus he knows his preaching is complete and that 'the hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified'.

Unless the grain of wheat dies, it remains all alone. If it dies it yields a 'rich harvest'. Jesus' death yields a rich harvest of followers with whom and in whom he is always present. We are not left to make the journey from temptation to transfiguration alone - Jesus is our constant companion. He is the way by which we get from one to the other.

Faith in (seeing) Jesus, draws us out of temptation and into transfiguration – to be the living presence of God in the world, the meeting places between human need and God's compassion, to be light and life for one another.

If we, too, 'want to see Jesus' we must look into our own hearts. It is there that God writes his law of love in the person of his Son. It is there that we discover the presence of One who loves us beyond death and who gently refashions us into the image and likeness of his Son.

They broke that covenant of mine, so I had to show them who was master. It is the Lord who speaks. No, this is the covenant I will make with the House of Israel when those days arrive – it is the Lord who speaks. Deep within them I will plant my Law, writing it on their hearts. Then I will be their God and they shall be my people. There will be no further need for neighbour to try to teach neighbour, or brother or sister to say to brother or sister, 'Learn to know the Lord!' No, they will all know me, the least no less than the greatest – it is the Lord who speaks – since I will forgive their iniquity and never call their sin to mind.

By these words he indicated the kind of death he would die.

bear you on the breath of dawn, make you to shine like the sun, and hold you in the palm of his hand.




