THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME - 17 November 2024

Dear sisters and brothers,

Take the fig tree as a parable, Jesus says in today's Gospel from St Mark. He goes on to say: as soon as its twigs grow supple and its leaves come out, you know that summer is near.

Through this imagery, St Mark is encouraging the early Christian community, suffering much oppression and persecution in Rome, to be alert to the signs of God's presence among them amidst all the difficulties and challenges they are facing in remaining faithful to following the Way of Jesus and hopeful, in the face of seemingly insurmountable odds, to his promise that his kingdom will ultimately triumph.

But as for that day or hour, (when God's kingdom will ultimately prevail) nobody knows it, Jesus goes on to say ... neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son; no one but the Father.

Two thousand years later, these words seem as relevant as ever as we reflect on the situation of our world, with so many wars, so many people being oppressed and persecuted, so many going hungry, so many living in poverty, so many being deprived of basic education and health care, so many suffering injustices of one kind or another.

It's easy to be discouraged, despite our prayers and practical efforts to assist those in need to the extent we are able. We can easily succumb to feeling "what's the use; nothing will ever change" and either give up in despair or turn away from the current realities.

In this situation, Jesus says to look at the fig tree (or whatever plant or flower we choose to think of), note the new life which springs from it and see it as a parable/sign/symbol that the new life of God's kingdom of peace and unity, joy, forgiveness and reconciliation will dawn in the fullness of time, even though we have no idea of when that will be. CARMELITE REFLECTION:

When the Son of Man appears

With the approach next Sunday of the Feast of Christ the King and the end of the Liturgical Year, our readings this Sunday take on an 'end times' feel.

In the Gospel Mark presents a vision of the full establishment of the Kingdom and the coming of Christ as the final proof of God's victory. The language is necessarily that of symbol and myth as it describes something yet to come, not an historical reality. But this does not mean that it has no relationship with reality.

The vision is set against the background of a time of distress. Early Christian communities, like Mark's, certainly endured much distress through persecution and suffering and their struggles to follow the teachings of Jesus.

The coming in glory of the risen Jesus together with the great gathering of his people from every corner of the earth, were meant as reassurance to a weary and frightened community of believers.

They have followed the way of discipleship, sharing in Jesus' suffering, some to the point of death. One day the final victory will be God's and they will enter with Jesus into the fullness of the Kingdom.

In the meantime, however, disciples have to learn to read the signs of the presence of Jesus in everyday life. Jesus is not sitting passively at God's right hand. Through the Holy Spirit he continues to be actively present in the hearts and lives of believers, and in the universe.

Neither are the disciples to wait passively for the final coming. We wait in patient hope, but not in idleness, because the ministry of making Christ present in every thought, word and action, and every moment of history, continues.

The Gospel ends on a note of uncertain certainty: Christ will come, but we don't know when.
