TWENTIETH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME - 18 August 2024

Dear sisters and brothers,

Today's Gospel from John 6 is the second last in the series of Readings we have been hearing concerning the *Bread of Life*. We've heard about the miracle of the loaves and fishes. We've heard Jesus explain to the crowds that this miracle, like the *manna* (bread) which fed the Israelites in the desert is a sign that points to himself as the real and lasting *bread of life - the bread of God ... which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world*. This bread is accessible to them through faith in Jesus and it draws them into his own eternal life.

Todays' Gospel reading explicitly focuses on the Christian Eucharist. It comes after his Jewish audience's objection that, since they know his mother and father, he cannot claim to be the one who has *come down from heaven*. In today's Reading, John tells his audience that, in order to share more fully in his life, they need to *eat* his flesh and *drink* his blood by sharing in the bread and wine of the Eucharistic celebration. Through this very physical action, undertaken in faith, they will be drawn into Jesus' eternal life with the Father.

It is good to keep in mind that John is writing for a mostly Jewish Christian community at the end of the 1st century A.D., long after the first disciples, who had a personal experience of Jesus, have died. John's audience are 2nd or 3rd generation Christians. They, as we, are invited to experience the living presence of Jesus in the celebration of Eucharist. In the Eucharist we are offered a *sacramental* rather than a physical experience of Jesus through the symbols of bread and wine, as well as through the Word of God proclaimed to us in the Scriptures and in the gathering in faith of the community to celebrate the Lord's Supper.

As we celebrate Eucharist today, we give thanks for the gift offered to us of the living, risen, eternal life of Jesus by eating his flesh and drinking his blood in the form of bread and wine, by hearing his Word in the Scriptures and by discerning his Spirit alive in the worshipping community. We pray that by accepting this gift we will be even more transformed by it and grow in our witness to the risen life of Jesus in which we share by offering our lives in love and service to others.

As foreshadowed last week, I offer the following summary of the discussion that occurred at the recent **Parish Leadership & Exploration Group (PLEG)** meeting, following the preceding Parish Meeting.

The following suggestions and comments were made:

- Issue of whether future Parish Meetings should be held during the day or night and the time of year for such a meeting will be canvassed among parishioners early next year.
- Suggestion of providing a Zoom option for such meetings to be further considered.
- Continue to offer transport to an in-person meeting.
- The presentations were good and affirming.
- Hard to formulate practical ideas for the future.
- Build on what we already do re involvement and outreach.
- How do we engage with those who aren't in the Church on Sundays the "nones"?
- Provide liturgies more focused on young people.
- Provide "Family Mass" for Galilee families.
- Leave Churches open during the day.
- We aren't just about getting people into the Churches on Sunday; look for further outreach projects e.g. blessing of animals.
- Tell people what we're doing communicate to the wider community.
- Extend invitation to come to weekday Mass and have coffee afterwards.
- Access other models of evangelization e.g. St Benedict's, Burwood
- Offer more Adult Education opportunities.
- Be people of kindness and welcome.
- Rediscover the treasure of the Gospels.
- Revive outreach to families who present children for Baptism.

- Consider creating a Playgroup for mothers and young children.
- Send birthday cards to children recently baptized.
- Send get well cards to sick parishioners.
- Improve the website
- Add family of newly baptized children and those recently married in the parish to the Newsletter email mailing list.
- Have more contact /collaboration with Sts Peter & Paul's parish.

PLEG will consider these ideas further at future meetings. Meanwhile, we would welcome any reactions/comments/suggestions in regard to these or any other matters concerning the ongoing development of our parish. Send any such ideas to parish@sj-mc.org.au

REFLECTION

Communion with Jesus and one another

In the Gospel, the dialogue between Jesus and the people continues. This time they are arguing about how Jesus could possibly give them his flesh to eat. Jesus insists that if they don't eat it they will not have life in them and they will not have eternal life.

Underlining the message by talking about his flesh being real food and his blood being real drink immediately connects this teaching of Jesus to the Eucharistic celebration. Some of these verses may well have been used by the Christians in John's time during their liturgy. But this reading is not only about the Eucharistic celebration, but also about what that celebration symbolises – the very life of God made present and visible in the person of Jesus and received in the sacramental signs of Bread and Wine. It is a celebration of being in communion with Jesus and the Father. Following the teaching of Jesus, it is also a celebration of being in communion with one another.

Intimate relationship (being in communion) with Jesus the 'bread of life', is the way in which Jesus feeds his people with his very self - his own flesh and blood – everything that he is. Food sustains and supports life and growth. To eat Jesus is to be caught up in the communion of life he shares with the Father and to feed on the very life of God. It is how we are sustained in and grow in our relationship with God. Eternal life is part of sharing the life of God.


