Dear sisters and brothers,

As Jesus continues his 'Sermon on the Mount' in this week's Gospel reading, he continues to emphasise that it is the values, attitudes, convictions and motivations that underpin our behaviour that is most important; much more so than any strict observance of "the Law and the Prophets" which might make us look good to others but which isn't motivated primarily by love for the other.

In following Jesus' "Way" of "fulfilling" the Law and the Prophets, we are challenged to go beyond observing their legal prescriptions and to really reach out to the other from our hearts in love and compassion and forgiveness, no matter who they are or what they have done. This is not easy! We can all think of instances where a loving, compassionate and forgiving response seems not only inappropriate, but stupid. This is the "wisdom of this world" which St Paul refers to in today's 2nd Reading. However, the "folly of the Cross", central to our Christian calling, suggests otherwise. God's love and compassion for us and forgiveness of us is total and unconditional, if we accept it ... no matter who we are or what we have done. Extraordinary! We are privileged to be called to follow the "Way" of Jesus. Hence, "turn the other cheek", be lavishly generous, "go the extra mile", "love your enemy". Ultimately, "be perfect just as your heavenly Father is perfect"!

What an extraordinary and challenging calling, to which we are all making faltering responses as "pilgrims" on a journey. But God, through the life of his Spirit in us, is with us on the journey ... loving, forgiving and encouraging us. May we continue our journey in faith and hope, ever reliant on and grateful for this boundless love, compassion, mercy and forgiveness for us ... and for all!

## REFLECTION ON THIS WEEK'S READINGS

### Warfare and the Church

'Be perfect as your Heavenly Father is perfect.' Is Jesus advocating rather static faultless-ness? Not very appealing! No, the Greek word is closer to the idea of a perfect wine – one that has matured and has reached its full potential. So, Our Lord is saying, 'Be a person who is everything you are capable of being.'

Our Lord gives a striking example of the challenge. God does not withhold life-giving sun and rain from people because they are bad or dishonest, nor extinguish the life of human beings because they are evil, because they are enemies.

What are the implications for Church teaching on capital punishment or warfare? Note that Jesus' command: 'You must be ...' is directed to You in the plural. It is communal, social. The Church community must listen. Is the Holy Spirit moving us in a direction not experienced since its first three centuries?

We could pause for a moment to pray on behalf of those who want to do us harm, the better to hear: 'Blessed are the peacemakers.'
