Dear sisters and brothers,

What a wonderful celebration we had last weekend of both our Parish Patronal Feast day of Our Lady of Mount Carmel and of Fr Hugh's restoration to public ministry and acknowledgment of his nine years' service as Parish Priest at the 9am Mass and then the luncheon afterwards.

All the Masses and the luncheon exuded a great spirit of unity, thanksgiving, joy and support and encouragement of another. Many thanks again to Cathy and those who assisted her in organising the lunch, preparing the Hall and cleaning up afterwards. Many others, too, assisted in ensuring the celebration of Masses were joyful and prayerful, particularly Sacristans, Musicians, Floral Artists, Readers, Commentators, Carmelites, Concelebrants and Ministers of the Eucharist. Every aspect of our celebrations expressed the unity among us, bound together in Christ.

When I think back on these celebrations and on our 2nd Reading today from the Letter to the Ephesians, I can't help but be struck by the contrast between the unity and joy of our community last weekend and the disunity and distress displayed and symbolised by the attempted assassination of the former President of the United States of America.

The divisions and lack of harmony in relations between people that is so evident in so much of our world today – and of which we aren't spared in our own country – are clarion calls to all of us to do whatever we can to sow peace and harmony among us, no matter our differences. We may feel that we can't do much to affect international, national or even local situations of discord, but all of us can pray and all of us can strive for right relationships with those within our sphere of influence. To whatever extent we are able, we are also challenged to extend that sphere and our influence within it.

The author of the Letter to the Ephesians (attributed to St Paul, but probably written by others who embraced his ideas) addresses the reality of the community of Ephesus, composed of both Jews and non-Jews, significantly different from one another in

REFLECTION

Shepherding each other with God's love

In the first reading the prophet Jeremiah laments the poor leadership given by those to whom the flock of God has been entrusted. He tells of the days to come when God will raise up true shepherds look after the flock and pasture (feed) them. The reading also looks forward to a true shepherd-king from the House of David who will act with wisdom, honesty and integrity to look after the people. He will 'save Judah' and will be called: The Lord, our integrity.

In the Gospel Mark shows Jesus to be a true shepherd whose heart is moved by the needs of both the people and his own disciples. The disciples have returned from their preaching and tell Jesus everything that happened to them. These exhausted shepherds are weary but the people keep coming to them, so much so that they had no time even to eat.

Jesus, moved by compassion for them, invites them to a place of quiet and rest, but the people guess where they are going and follow them. Instead of sending the people away, Jesus himself sets about teaching them while the disciples rest. He feeds the people with the Word of God. It is what genuine love does, isn't it? It helps us go the 'extra mile' even when we think we are at the end of our tether.

And that is how Jesus meet us, too, as a shepherd-king, with genuine concern for us - not as a warrior-king with threats and punishments.

In the Gospel next Sunday Jesus will feed the people with the loaves and fish. Like a true shepherd Jesus looks after all the needs and hungers of his flock – feeding hearts as well as bodies. It is a very grounded approach that Jesus offers which does not ignore either spiritual or physical hungers and needs. As followers of Christ, we, too, try to be people who meet the real hungers and needs of our brothers and sisters and all entrusted to our care.

Ephesians 2:13-18


