CARMELITE REFLECTION

Two more stories of transformation

Luke's wonderful story of the two disciples on the way to Emmaus is another story of transformation through personal encounter with the risen Jesus.

It is a heart-warming story and we can easily identify with the two disciples feeling crushed by the weight of their shattered dreams. They don't believe the story of the women that Jesus is alive.

They don't recognise the stranger when he walks beside them. Perhaps that's because they are so involved in their own hurt and disappointment, and doesn't that sometimes happen to us, too?

What does Jesus do? First, he invites them to share with him their story, he lets them talk it out. Then he draws them into the bigger story of his life, death and resurrection by unfolding the scriptures for them. In other words, he gives them a sense of perspective. He puts their story in touch with the bigger story of God's purpose.

Their hope is being rebuilt and their hearts are beginning 'to burn' as Jesus talks. They are beginning to 'catch fire' again. When they arrive at Emmaus, Jesus makes as if to go on, but the disciples beg him to stay.

At table Jesus takes the bread, says the traditional Jewish blessing (like Grace Before Meals) and breaks the loaf and the eyes of these faithful, yet blind, disciples are opened to recognise him.

The disciples can scarcely contain themselves and set out immediately to return

Due to most unfortunate and unavoidable circumstances, Elise Rimington, who generously committed to preparing parents for their children's Baptism and preparing children from schools other than Galilee for the Sacraments of 1st Reconciliation, 1st Communion and Confirmation, has had to relinquish her involvement in this important ministry.

The plan had been that:

- Baptism preparation would be held on the 1st Sunday of each month after the 10:30am Mass at OLMC.
- Preparation for 1st Reconciliation would be after the 10:30am Mass on Sunday 28th May with 1st Reconciliation itself being celebrated on Wednesday 31st May.

REFLECTION

Companionable Breaking of Bread

This story is the story of each one of us at Mass. Each Mass is structured on the Road to Emmaus travelogue.

Two men set off on a journey of their own making. At the beginning of Mass we confess that we have gone off course.

The traveller helps the men on the road to Emmaus understand what had happened to Jesus of Nazareth by showing God's plan revealed in the Hebrew Scriptures. In the Liturgy of the Word, we hear Scriptures expounded, revealing more fully the true identity of Jesus of Nazareth. Every so often you will experience the burning sensation in your heart as something that is said hits home.

The traveller takes bread, blesses it, and gives it to them to eat. In that moment of breadsharing, the two men recognised their travelling companion as the Risen Lord. Eat the bread consecrated at Mass, and we receive into our very being the Divine Companion for our journey through life.

We could pause for a moment to thank God for the privilege at every Mass of having our eyes opened so that we recognise Our Risen Lord Jesus Christ in the breaking of the bread.

Alleluia!

FIRST READING Acts 2:14, 22-33

On the day of Pentecost, Peter stood up with the Eleven and addressed the crowd in a loud voice: 'Men of Israel, listen to what I am going to say: Jesus the Nazarene was a man commended to you by God by the miracles and portents and signs that God worked through him when he was among you, as you all know. This man, who was put into your power by the deliberate intention and foreknowledge of God, you took and had crucified by men outside the Law. You killed him, but God raised him to life, freeing him from the pangs of Hades; for it was impossible for him to be held in its power since, as David says of him:

I saw the Lord before me always, for with him at my right hand nothing can shake me. So my heart was glad and my tongue cried out with joy: my body, too, will rest in the hope that you will not abandon my soul to Hades nor allow your holy one to experience corruption. You have made known the way of life to me, you will fill me with gladness through your presence.

'Brothers, no one can deny that the patriarch David himself is dead and buried: his tomb is still with us. But since he was a prophet, and knew that God had sworn him an oath to make one of his descendants succeed him on the throne, what he foresaw and spoke about was the resurrection of the Christ: he is the one who was not abandoned to Hades, and whose body did not experience corruption. God raised this man Jesus to life, and all of us are witnesses to that. Now raised to the heights by God's right hand, he has received from the Father the Holy Spirit, who was promised, and what you see and hear is the outpouring of that Spirit.'



SECOND READING

St Peter 1:17-21

If you are acknowledging as your Father one who has no favourites and judges everyone according to what he has done, you must be scrupulously careful as long as you are living away from your home. Remember, the ransom that was paid to free you from the useless way of life your ancestors handed down was not paid in anything corruptible, neither in silver nor gold, but in the precious blood of a lamb without spot or stain, namely Christ; who, though known since before the world was made, has been revealed only in our time, the end of the ages, for your sake. Through him you now have faith in God, who raised him from the dead and gave him glory for that very reason – so that you would have faith and hope in God.



Two of the disciples of Jesus were on their way to a village called Emmaus, seven miles from Jerusalem, and they were talking together about all that had happened. Now as they talked this over, Jesus himself came up and walked by their side; but something prevented them from recognising him. He said to them, 'What matters are you discussing as you walk along?' They stopped short, their faces downcast.

Then one of them, called Cleopas, answered him, 'You must be the only person staying in Jerusalem who does not know the things that have been happening there these last few days.' What things?' he asked. 'All about Jesus of Nazareth' they answered 'who proved he was a great prophet by the things he said and did in the sight of God and of the whole people; and how our chief priests and our leaders handed him over to be sentenced to death, and had him crucified. Our own hope had been that he would be the one to set Israel free. And this is not all: two whole days have gone by since it all happened; and some women from our group have astounded us: they went to the tomb in the early morning, and when they did not find the body, they came back to tell us they had seen a vision of angels who declared he was alive. Some of our friends went to the tomb and found everything exactly as the women had reported, but of him they saw nothing.'

Then he said to them, 'You foolish men! So slow to believe the full message of the prophets! Was it not ordained that the Christ should suffer and so enter into his glory?' Then, starting with Moses and going through all the prophets, he explained to them the passages throughout the scriptures that were about himself.

When they drew near to the village to which they were going, he made as if to go on; but they pressed him to stay with them. 'It is nearly evening' they said 'and the

day is almost over.' So he went in to stay with them. Now while he was with them at table, he took the bread and said the blessing; then he broke it and handed it to them. And their eyes were opened and they recognised him; but he had vanished from their sight. Then they said to each other, 'Did not our hearts burn within us as he talked to us on the road and explained the scriptures to us?'

They set out that instant and returned to Jerusalem. There they found the Eleven assembled together with their companions, who said to them, 'Yes, it is true. The Lord has risen and has appeared to Simon.' Then they told their story of what had happened on the road and how they had recognised him at the breaking of bread.





in 2011, the **Falms** program calebrated sixty years of reaching beyond. Since first being prepared in (961 for mission to Papus New Guinea, Cacholic participants from all over Australia and New Zealand have been placed in forty countries, assisting the development of 408 communities globally.

Marking a jubilee in this era was a stark reminder that so-one can rest on their jaurels. Like all of us, Pales Australia has continued to adupt to COVID normal. Their operational challenges have teen insignificant compared to the impact of COVID-19 on the oversets communities that they support.

Pales is reduabling its efforts in response to communities request to assist individual and organisational capacity through skill exchange. Now that restrictions on international travel are starting to ease, new skilled and committed applicants will be throughly prepared for their cross-cultural mession in remote partures, whools and communities.

I encourage you to promote opportunities for individuals to impage in a Palms Global Plasion. Also, based on their sing years of preparing Australians to work and love across cultures they now have a Neighbourn. Without, Barriers program to use Australian parallels and schools to better embrace diversity and built on gifts to grow stronger commution.

These considering a global mission placement abroad can be advised of the following support:

- The Archdoome will support the proparation costs of participants at Palme" Orientation Causes and a re-entry weekeed on their return from mission placement.
- Catholic Biohops support a Lay Missionery Gratuity Fund that provides a payment of \$2,500 for each year one is on the mission.
- Paims negotiations with Catholic schools assures great support and benefits for teachers giving up to two years for this mission. Teachers should talk with Palms about the details.

The Palms mission offers a wonderful opportunity to affirm the dignity of all while "protecting and implementing the development goals that are supported by our despect religious and ethical values." (Pope Francis).
