## OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE - 24 November 2024

Dear sisters and brothers,

Today's feast of Christ the King presents us with an image of Jesus that can be somewhat challenging as Jesus is not a "king" in the way in which this title is usually understood.

One senses Pilate's confusion about what Jesus is on about, as related in today's Gospel Reading from John, when he asks Jesus if he is the king of the Jews, as his accusers have claimed. Jesus' reply turns the question back on Pilate – "it is you who say it" - but then he elaborates to proclaim that his kingship is not "of this world". That is, it is not one of power, domination, normal worldly authority, self-aggrandisement or material wealth – but a kingship which is "to bear witness to the truth".

Having explained that he is a "king", but not in the conventional sense, Jesus then outlines who gives him allegiance as "king". It is those who are "on the side of truth".

To be "on the side of truth", as Jesus means it, is to accept that Jesus reveals who God is – and God is love! To give allegiance to Jesus and to be on the side of truth is to accept the primacy of love in our lives and to put it into practice.

Jesus put love into practice completely when he gave up his life on the cross. He suffered for this truth – this love, but in doing so he was "lifted up" to risen glory. He was gloriously transformed by the love – the truth – to which he surrendered completely. As those who give allegiance to Jesus – and thus "are on the side of truth" – we must "listen to his voice".

We, too, can expect that in "bearing witness to the truth", we will also suffer for it in some way, as countless followers of Jesus have done down through the ages and continue to do so today. We will hopefully be spared the horrors of suffering that Jesus himself and many others of his followers have endured but giving ourselves in love to others inevitably and naturally involves self-sacrifice. It is in loving – in "bearing witness to the truth", that we proclaim the reality of

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the kingdom of God here and now and are “lifted up” to risen glory – through, with and in Jesus!

God’s kingdom will be fully realised in the fullness of time – we know not when; here and now, though, we give witness to it by our love. We give thanks for the love – the life - of God into which we are incorporated by our baptism. We pray that we might grow in the truth - the love – to which we give allegiance and pray that God’s kingdom will come in all its fullness.

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At our last Parish Leadership and Exploration Group (PLEG) meeting for the year last Tuesday night, we reflected on the past 15 months of our operation and thought about how we might develop as we move into 2025. In the immediate term, we reviewed arrangements for the production and distribution of Christmas Cards for the wider local community and on arrangements for the upcoming Parish Social and Volunteers lunch. Everything is progressing smoothly. We also noted, pleasingly, the extensive work recently undertaken to tidy up the grounds and gardens surrounding our parish buildings and the new sign outside St Joseph’s Church. We took note of the roof repairs undertaken to date on Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church and recognized that this is the first part of ongoing significant roofing works required on that Church (and there is also work required to address leaks and salt damp at St Joseph’s Church).

We reflected on our focus on “Synodality” throughout the year and how this typifies what we see as our primary function of trying to help our community deepen its spirituality and faith. To that end, we are looking to offer a Lenten program next year in preparation for Easter. As part of our spirituality and faith development, as well as our missionary outreach, we will also be looking for ways to strengthen community bonds next year by extending the outreach of our eNewsletter, publishing more news items on our website and building up a more comprehensive “Register” of parishioners, along with sustaining and, if possible, growing our Parish Thanksgiving program. Additionally, we will be looking to arrange at least four significant community events next year, centering around the Feast of St Joseph (March), the Feast of Our lady of Mount Carmel (July), the Feast of St Francis of Assisi (October – with a blessing of animals), and Christmas.

We will also be looking to ways in which we can establish a more formal Parish Council structure, as required by both the 2022 Plenary Council of the Australian Catholic Church and the recent Synod on Synodality. Plenty to keep us busy, to look forward to and, hopefully, to engage the wider parish community – and beyond.

## CARMELITE REFLECTION:

### *A Royal Shepherd*

On this last Sunday of the Church's year we always celebrate the Feast of Christ, the Universal King.

The first reading from the prophet, Daniel, speaks of the coming of one who will rule in the name of God in an eternal kingdom. The second reading from the Book of the Apocalypse speaks of Christ as the 'faithful witness' to God and 'ruler of the kings of the earth'. Here is a king who loves his people and sheds his own blood to save them.

The Gospel comes from the Passion of Jesus in St John's Gospel. It is Jesus' dialogue with Pilate about his kingship and the nature of his kingdom.

Jesus is anything but a traditional king. This King reigns, not from a golden throne, but a cross of rough wood; naked, with no rich, flowing robes; no jewelled crown, just thorns; no orb and sceptre, just nails in his hands.

He comes among his people, not as a tyrant wielding weapons of suffering and death, but as a powerless baby.

Jesus says that his kingdom is 'not of this world'. It is not a kingdom with geographical and national boundaries. It is not a kingdom in the earthly sense where power and oppression reign, but a kingdom where justice, love, mercy, truth and peace reign.

At the end of the day, the disciple is called to be the Kingdom (the living presence) of God in the world and to transform the suffering of its people into joy by deeds of loving kindness.

Virtuous disciples are the living presence of Jesus in the world. They realise that until Jesus comes again, the kingdom has been entrusted into their hands. In the Kingdom of Jesus, the disciple is not master but 'servant'.

The power of the spirit of Jesus fuels deeds of loving kindness – reversing horrible human conditions and bringing healing and salvation.

Whenever we act like Christ the Kingdom of God (the reign of God's grace) breaks into our world.

Whenever we are moved by the Spirit to proclaim the truth, to respond to need, to work for justice, to transform and heal our society, the Kingdom of God breaks into human reality and the grace of God becomes clearly visible in our words and actions.

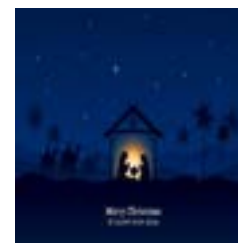
