CELEBRATION OF THE CANONISATION OF ST. TITUS BRANDSMA

The Carmelites and the Parish community are celebrating the recent canonisation of Titus Brandsma by Pope Francis on Sunday, 31 July at 10:30 am at Our Lady of Mount Carmel. You are all warmly to celebrate with us this remarkable man whose life was a testimony to the power of life over death, goodness over evil. Titus' life was a full one and was multi-faceted yet this "dangerous little friar" was prepared to be faith-filled until his execution by the Nazis.

Titus has been declared the patron of journalists and is a constant reminder of the call to be truth-tellers in our world.







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Genesis 18:20-32

The Lord said, 'How great an outcry there is against Sodom and Gomorrah! How grievous is their sin! I propose to go down and see whether or not they have done all that is alleged in the outcry against them that has come up to me. I am determined to know.'

Luke 11:1-13

Once Jesus was in a certain place praying, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said, 'Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples.' He said to them, 'Say this when you pray:

"Father, may your name be held holy,
 your kingdom come;
 give us each day our daily bread,
 and forgive us our sins,
 for we ourselves forgive each one who is in debt to us.
 And do not put us to the test."

He also said to them, 'Suppose one of you has a friend and goes to him in the middle of the night to say, "My friend, lend me three loaves, because a friend of mine on his travels has just arrived at my house and I have nothing to offer him"; and the man answers from inside the house, "Do not bother me. The door is bolted now, and my children and I are in bed; I cannot get up to give it to you." I tell you, if the man does not get up and give it him for friendship's sake, persistence will be enough to make him get up and give his friend all he wants.

'So I say to you: Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you. For the one who asks always receives; the one who searches always finds; the one who knocks will always have the door opened to him. What father among you would hand his son a stone when he asked for bread? Or hand him a snake instead of a fish? Or hand him a scorpion if he asked for an egg? If you then, who are evil, know how to give your children what is good, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!'


