Pentecost Sunday 28 May 2023

Dear sisters and brothers,

This weekend we celebrate the feast of Pentecost.

As with last week's feast of the *Ascension of the Lord*, the descriptions of what happened at *Pentecost* that we find in today's 1st Reading from St Luke's *Acts of the Apostles* and in *St John's Gospel* are quite different.

The Acts of the Apostles refers to the Jewish feast of Pentecost. This feast was celebrated on the 50th day after the Passover. For the Jews, Pentecost was a celebration to acknowledge that the Law (10 Commandments) which had been given to Moses and the people on Mt Sinai was the First Fruits of the Exodus – the Passover - of the Israelites from slavery in Egypt to freedom in the promised land of Israel. For Christians, Pentecost became a celebration to acknowledge that the First Fruits of the new Passover – the Resurrection of Jesus – was the gift of the Holy Spirit. In the Acts of the Apostles, St Luke relates the reception of these First Fruits, the Holy Spirit, through the story of tongues of fire coming to rest on the apostles, transforming and empowering them to give witness to others of the power of the risen Jesus in their lives.

By contrast, St John's *Gospel* doesn't have any such story to convey the same truth that the risen Jesus imparts the gift of the Holy Spirit to his disciples. Rather, John has Jesus appear to his frightened disciples on the evening of the same day as his resurrection, wish them peace and joy and commission and empower them to be his witnesses before the world by enabling them to be his agents of peace and joy and forgiveness.

As we celebrate, today, the gift of the Holy Spirit, whom we have received, we give thanks for the peace, joy and forgiveness this gift brings us and we pray that we will allow the Holy Spirit to empower us to be witnesses to the peace, joy and forgiveness of the risen Christ in our world.

REFLECTION

Sent to be God's love in the world

At Pentecost we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit to the first group of Christian believers - the disciples. This gift of the Holy Spirit is the culmination of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus.

It would be wrong to think that this gift happened only once, in one moment of history. In fact, the gifting of the Holy Spirit is a continuing event in the life of every believing person and, therefore, in every age of human history. The Holy Spirit is the presence of God with us - the enduring way in which Jesus remains present in the Church and in the life of each person.

Today we do not pray to receive the Holy Spirit. The presence of the Holy Spirit in us has been affirmed and proclaimed in the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation. Instead, we pray to grow more aware of the Spirit's presence in our lives and to allow that Spirit to grow within us, gradually re-shaping our minds and hearts in the image of Jesus.

Pentecost brings to a close the fifty days of the Church's Easter celebrations. Soon we will begin Ordinary Time again. So, our feast today helps us understand that we take the Holy Spirit with us into the ordinary events and tasks of each day.

That is how we allow the sacred to touch, heal and transform us and the world around us.

The spiritual search is for the heart of God within our own. When we enter into relationship with Christ through the Spirit, the gifts begin to flow more abundantly. The Spirit is the source of reconciliation with ourselves and with each other. Reconciliation is essential if we are to 'hold and guard' each other in the midst of all that life throws at us, especially at the moment.

The Spirit brings gifts of wisdom, courage, understanding, right judgement, knowledge, reverence, wonder and awe in God's presence. May we be graced by them all as we discern and decide how we can best work together to build up each other and to let God's love be seen at work in each of us.

FIRST READING

Acts 2:1-11

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. 




