Second Sunday of Easter - 7 April 2024

Dear sisters and brothers.

Each year, on this Second Sunday of Easter, we hear the story from St John's Gospel of Jesus' appearance to the disciples, huddled together in fear, after his death and resurrection. He assures them of the reality that it is truly him who is risen from death by showing them the wounds inflicted on him in the cruelty of his crucifixion. He bestows the gift of the Holy Spirit on them and commissions them to carry on his mission of communicating God's saving love to all people.

We also hear that Thomas was not with them and wouldn't believe that Jesus had risen from the dead unless he experienced a personal revelation of the risen Lord, which he was granted eight days later. History has given Thomas a bad "wrap" by ascribing to him the title of "doubting Thomas". However, rather than casting critical aspersions on him, we would do well to see in Thomas's doubt something of our own struggles with faith and the struggles of many people of our time.

In fact, I think there is something healthy about having our doubts, particularly at different times and in different situations, in our lives. Growth in faith, in fact, only comes about when we acknowledge our doubts and yet, in spite of them, put our trust and hope in the risen Lord and in the new life which he offers us; a life in which good ultimately conquers evil, love conquers hate, forgiveness trumps resentment and revenge. This is the life to which we dedicate ourselves and to which we are commissioned, empowered by the Holy Spirit, to promote in the world by our witness.

Having come to terms with his doubts in light of his personal experience of the risen Lord, Thomas makes a sublime act of faith when he proclaims: My Lord and my God. We, who have not personally "seen" the risen Lord are declared, by him, especially blessed in our faith: Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.

REFLECTION

Two Stories of Transformation

The great Easter feast of last Sunday began the Church's fifty-day celebration of the Resurrection which concludes with the feast of Pentecost in six weeks.

The Gospel of each Sunday is a meditation on Jesus as: the resurrected Christ, made known in the scriptures and the breaking of the bread, the bearer of life in all its fullness, our way, truth and life, pledge of God's love.

In today's Gospel reading there are two stories of transformation through encounter with the risen Jesus.

Firstly, Jesus appears to a group of frightened and bewildered disciples hiding in a room. His first words are, 'Peace be with you'. Fear and bewilderment turn into joy as the disciples recognise the presence of the Risen Jesus with them. But that's not all. He then sends them out to be missionaries of peace and forgiveness. In receiving the Holy Spirit they are transformed from a group of frightened people, hiding in a room, to bold proclaimers of God's love and mercy.

The second story in today's Gospel is the one we all know as doubting Thomas, though, really, it should be known as believing Thomas - doubt is only the beginning of the story.

Jesus doesn't scold or rebuke Thomas. If Thomas is looking for proof, he has only to touch Jesus to see he is real. But Thomas doesn't do that. It is his personal encounter with Jesus which transforms him from doubter to believer.

It is yet another Gospel reminder that faith is not about believing with our minds or in looking for proof. It is found only in our living relationship with Jesus.

Perhaps these days give us a bit more time just to sit and chat with Jesus, to recognise him already present in our hearts, to allow our fears and doubts to be overcome by love, to find new, creative ways of transforming darkness into light, peace and joy for others.

May the new life we celebrate over the next fifty days bring us the creativity of Spirit we need to be the living heart of God in our world today.



Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him:

'You believe because you can see me. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.'


