FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - 7 July 2024

Dear sisters and brothers,

On the first Sunday of July each year, the Catholic Church in Australia observes Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday. On this day we gather as one to honour and celebrate the rich cultural heritage and contributions of our First Nations Peoples to our Catholic Church.

The theme for this year's Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday is 'Keep the Fire Burning – Strong in Faith'. The National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council (NATSICC) has reflected on this theme and on today's Gospel Reading from Mark, which tells the story of Jesus returning to His hometown, only to be met with scepticism and disbelief. Despite His teachings and miracles, however, those who knew Him best failed to recognise His divine wisdom and power.

NATSICC'S reflection (https://www.natsicc.org.au/2024-atsi-sunday.html#nr) states that This passage resonates deeply with our own experiences as First Australians, as we can often find that our voices go unheard and our contributions not embraced. The refection continues: The recent Voice referendum highlighted the ongoing journey toward recognition and reconciliation. While the outcome was not what many hoped for, it has strengthened our resolve and commitment to working together for a better Australia for everyone. Like Jesus, who persevered in His mission despite the obstacles, we too remain committed to our Culture, our Land, our Church, and our communities with unwavering hope and determination.

Continuing its reflection, NATSICC invites us to be one with our First Nations' brothers and sisters as we gather on this sacred land to acknowledge the Traditional Custodians and honour their Elders past and present and their young people. The reflection reminds us that, for 1st Nations peoples, *Our connection to the land, waters, and skies is deeply rooted in our identity and spirituality.* They invite us to join them *in respecting and cherishing this connection, as it is vital to our shared journey of faith.* Their prayer, which they also invite us to share with them, is that the celebration of this Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday will *deepen our understanding and appreciation of the diverse cultures and histories of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples.*

Be with those who struggle with disease and illness, tension and tragedy.


Help us bring peace and reconciliation wherever it is needed.

REFLECTION

True faith - seeing the sacred everywhere

Traditionally, the prophets in the Bible had a pretty tough time. Many experienced rejection and persecution and even death. The first reading tells part of the story of Ezekiel's call to be a prophet.

Common to all the prophets is the conviction that the Word of the Lord must be spoken to the people 'whether they listen or not' - the prophet must remain faithful to his vocation even if it costs him his life.

In the Gospels Jesus is presented as the prophet par excellence. In this Sunday's Gospel we find Jesus in his home town, Nazareth, teaching in the synagogue - faithfully fulfilling his mission to proclaim the Good News. As for many other prophets, that proclamation will eventually cost him his life. Like the other prophets, Jesus, too, experiences rejection. At first the people marvel at Jesus' teaching and the miracles he has worked elsewhere, but soon they decide that he is just'a carpenter (craftsman)' whose family they know well. Nothing special to be seen here, they seem to think. The old saying, familiarity breeds contempt, seems to sum up their attitude, especially when they refer to Jesus as the son of his mother. Jews were customarily known by their father's name even if the father had died. Jesus is astonished at their lack of faith.

Faith, in this context, implies an openness to perceive the presence and action of God (the Kingdom). Clearly, the people don't perceive the action of God in Jesus in spite of the impressive words he spoke and the miracles he performed. Were Jesus' family circumstances just too ordinary for them? They couldn't look beyond what was familiar to them in order to see God at work in him. Without that essential openness Jesus finds he can't work any great miracle among them even though he can cure a few sick people.

Faith is about being in relationship with Jesus (and therefore, with God). Relationships grow as people come to know and understand each other. In a faith relationship, we change as we begin to get to know Jesus and we come to see with his eyes, feel with his heart and act with his intention in the world.

Only when we begin to see with the eyes of Jesus can we perceive the otherwise 'hidden' presence of God in human beings and events. We begin to see the sacred 'hidden' in the secular and the ordinary.

Only with faith can we see the action of God enfolded in the ordinary and familiar, the presence of the divine in the human, the sacred in the secular. So, to us, the division between sacred and secular almost disappears and almost everything appears 'sacred', and not just 'merely' human or secular.




